Foreword

Overview: The Illinois Fire Chiefs Association in cooperation with MABAS has established a goal of statewide mutual aid for fire, EMS and associated special operational services. Additionally, IEMA and ITTF have been placed in charge of domestic terrorism planning and response coordination. Accordingly, a key response and operational consideration in dealing with a domestic terrorism event are adequate hazardous materials, technical rescue and EMS teams capable of providing sustained, seamless and standardized operations. MABAS and non-MABAS fire departments have collaborated to achieve the goal. The release of this guidance document is in response to domestic terrorism events and other risks triggering a Declaration of Disaster and statewide non-discriminatory fire/EMS and rescue mutual aid system within the State of Illinois Emergency Operations plan. The Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) is the designated coordination and authorizing entity, through statute.

It must be noted that this procedure does not apply, direct or influence MABAS operations or agreements as utilized on a daily basis by member agencies. The procedure is applicable when invoked by IEMA, IDPH, and State Fire Marshal through a state declaration of disaster, IEMA special authorization for response without a declaration of disaster, or through a voluntary request for assistance as coordinated by IEMA, OSFM, or IDPH EMS.

Various status conditions apply when an IEMA/SEOC request is made.

Participation

Participating agencies in the Statewide Mutual Aid Plan must either be a MABAS agency or have signed a MOU directly with IEMA. Failure to do either does not jeopardize IEMA directed responses to a non-participating community.

Activation / Authorization Status Conditions

Declaration of Disaster: As recommended by IEMA and approved by the Governor of Illinois. Under a Declaration of Disaster, any and all fire, EMS and rescue resources may be requested, mobilized and deployed to a stricken area. All resources requested and which respond under IEMA's request and fire control center's direction are afforded all powers contained within Declaration of Disaster statute such as; Workmen's Compensation, liability protection, insurance, reimbursement, etc. Activation under a declaration initiates and will follow the Statewide Mutual Aid Flow Plan which is based on a 20% resource maximum response and 80% stay at home, reserve capacity.

IEMA Special Authorization for Response (without a Declaration of Disaster): Under highly unusual circumstances, IEMA might authorize and request mobilization of fire/EMS/special team operations without a Declaration of Disaster. When IEMA makes such statewide mutual aid requests, it is authorized and statutory protections are provided, however, reimbursements may not be available. Illinois statute requires a Declaration of Disaster for full protection, privileges and reimbursements. Understand that this condition is entirely different than a voluntary request for assistance.

Voluntary Request for Assistance: From time to time, IEMA and/or the OSFM may receive requests for fire, EMS and rescue assistance from a stricken community where a declaration of Disaster is not applicable, nor been declared. In such cases, these requests are purely voluntary in nature and such requests can be denied by any municipal fire, EMS or rescue agency.

In the event such a voluntary request for fire, EMS or rescue services are accepted by a local municipal agency, they do so at their own risk and without reimbursement, compensation or liability protection as afforded through Declaration of Disaster.

IEMA, IDPH, and OSFM officials only facilitate such requests of voluntary assistance through Illinois Fire Chiefs Association and/or MABAS. In all cases involving requests for voluntary assistance, all involved agencies may respectfully decline to respond without reason.

MABAS Agency Request for Assistance: MABAS agencies requesting mutual aid assistance may do so through normal operating procedures and exclude any contact, facilitation or approval by IEMA, IDPH and/or OSFM. Should the requesting MABAS agency's jurisdiction require a Declaration of Disaster, they may do so through proper channels to IEMA. Should a Declaration of Disaster be approved, all requests for assistance should be processed through the State EOC and concurrence gained by IEMA, IDPH, and/or OSFM representatives. If concurrence and approval is given by IEMA, IDPH and/or OSFM representatives, all Declaration of Disaster statutory powers are applicable and afforded the stricken community. Normally MABAS requests may involve interdivisional, task force or disaster box cards.

Records and Documentation

It is critical whenever an authorized activation of the statewide mutual aid is initiated; documentation and records of authorizing actions are kept. This includes dispatch centers, the stricken community, state EOC and agency/organization representatives. Such documentation may begin as handwritten notes, later formalized on incident forms, narratives, receipts and the like.

All such documentation will assist in reimbursement actions in recouping partial expenses associated with costs beyond normal, routine operations.

Responding Resource Standards

Equipment and staffing of responding equipment shall be compliant with MABAS standards, IDPH (EMS) and practices (non-MABAS). Equipment, staffing and incident command, accountability and safety standards as adopted by MABAS shall prevail. Haz-Mat and TRT Teams listed on Mutual Aid Flow Sheets shall comply with all statewide standards adopted by MABAS and ITTF.

Local Initiation of Statewide Mutual Aid Assistance

Local emergency, public safety officials must pursue requests for statewide mutual aid procedures through concurrent parallel contacts with their ESDA/IEMA offices at the local, county and state IEMA (Springfield) level SEOC. Activation and authorization to mobilize statewide mutual aid fire or specialized operations teams can only occur through Illinois Emergency Management Agency. EMS personnel and equipment will be activated/mobilized upon the authorization of the IOHNO (IDPH).

Statewide Mutual Aid Fire/EMS/Special Team Participation

To participate in the statewide mutual aid program within the capacity of sending units/resources to a stricken community, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is required between the agency and IEMA. All MABAS agencies are included, as an MOU has been signed between IEMA and the MABAS

Executive Board (P-1-3). Any and all non-MABAS agencies must either sign a MOU with IEMA or affiliate with MABAS. It is important to note that a stricken community will receive fire/EMS/Special Team mutual aid under a Declaration of Disaster regardless of whether they have or have not signed an MOU. The receipt of resources under a Declaration of Disaster is non-discriminatory. Once directed by the State EOC and transmitted through RED Center, the single point of statewide mobilization for Fire, EMS and Special Operations Team resources. RED Center shall be known as the "control" in command and control for mobilization purposes.

CART Agencies: CART agencies listed within the plan shall be dispatched upon the direction of IEMA to RED Center. RED Center shall authorize Orland Central to mobilize CART agency teams as directed by IEMA or as listed on the plan's mutual aid flow sheets.

IEMA MUTUAL AID REQUEST

Procedural Overview

Purpose

Provide a procedure for mutual aid requests at the direction of the State of Illinois Emergency Operations Center (SEOC), through mobilization control direction by RED Center (or their backup, Orland Central).

Scope

Upon the direction of IEMA, through the SEOC and its authorized agents, typically the Office of the State Fire Marshal and/or IDPH (EMS) and/or other state agencies authorized by IEMA, RED Center shall operate as the sole coordination and initiation site of all fire, specialized teams throughout the State of Illinois, MABAS or non-MABAS affiliation. The RED Center will coordinate EMS resource support with the IOHNO (Illinois Operations Headquarters and Notifications Office) upon the direction of IDPH (EMS).

Procedural Overview

- Familiarize yourself with the attached documents as reference guides and contact numbers to resources.
- Dispatch center's should obtain a copy of the Statewide Mutual Aid Planning Guide, or as it is called "Coloring Book" and complete the work sections with their local coordinating Fire Chiefs.
- IEMA, State EOC will contact RED Center (Northbrook) with mutual aid disaster requests by telephone numbers (847) 724-5700, or (847) 272-2121. In all cases, it is strongly encouraged that telephone communications from IEMA/SEOC or other MABAS/non-MABAS agencies be done on recorded message systems. The IEMA SEOC contact telephone numbers are (800) 782-7860, or (217) 782-7860. Departments or MABAS Divisions shall not telephone RED Center or the State's EOC to request they be directed to respond. The Statewide Flow Plans will be followed.
- Secure bona fide requests from the state IEMA/SEOC by obtaining the caller's name, state agency, call back phone numbers with alternative contact numbers, and the authorization/activation status of the event. RED Center operators shall upon initial contact by SEOC for plan activation, call the state EOC back and validate the activation through a direct conversation with IEMA's SEOC manager on duty. The SEOC manager's authorization will confirm and validate the response. A mission number may or may not be provided; however the IEMA SEOC manager on duty is the sole authorizing authority.
- Upon receiving a request for assistance from IEMA/SEOC, maintain a log of events, times and contacts.
- Upon receiving an IEMA request, confirm and cross-check the pages (letters & numbers) between RED and IEMA SEOC to assure both points are using the same resource flow page(s). Start with checklist page E1.
- Recall at least one RED Center dispatcher to assist in handling workload.
- Notify MABAS Executive Board member(s) as listed in attachment. Recall a RED Center Chief to be at RED Center and authorize changes in the flow pan.
- Clearly identify from IEMA/SEOC the following:
 - a) Location/town hosting incident.
 - b) State of Illinois regional reference (I-East, I-West, II, III) *see footnote (pg. B-3 & C-3)
 - c) Most appropriate major road routing to the incident and refueling sites/enroute service sites.
 - d) The incident mobilization reception site (not the same as staging area).
 - e) The specific type of equipment being requested (engine, heavy squads, ambulances, etc.).
 - f) The specific number of units being requested for responses from each category or type.

- g) If specialized teams or resources are being requested – how many teams and what type, such as;
 - Hazardous materials
 - Special rescue/technical rescue
 - Command Overhead Liaison Officers
 - CART (technical rescue)
 - Task Force Resource Packages
 - EMS Resources
 - Designated resources (tankers, brush trucks, etc.)
 - Antidote Kits
 - Paramedic assistance to local health departments/agencies.
 - Administrative support packages.
 - Manpower (heavy squads) to assist IDPH in setting up pretreatment sites.
- h) Refer to appendices to gain knowledge of resources and location of same.
- i) Determine the routing you will direct mutual aid units to use to get to reception area and key convoy points along major roads.
- j) Determine reception site access security validation code by RED Center operator (number, color, object)

- a) Figure your game plan on who to send by:
 - Who has the needed resource.
 - Which MABAS and non-MABAS agencies are directed on the flow plan.
 - Utilize the resource flow plans, based on regions and type of resources requested.
 - Dispatchers at RED Center may vary in notification sequence from resource flow pages if common sense and an improved response might result.
 - When conflict exists seek direction from a recalled RED Center Chief.
- b) If the flowplan requires modification due to unavoidable assigned units, don't strip an entire region of resource – create a checkerboard from area to area to leave available resource for other unrelated incidents. IDPH (EMS) will identify EMS resources for the RED Center to support the incident response.
- c) Handle like any request for a task force or equipment – your job is not to dispatch specific departments but rather instruct the MABAS Division or non-MABAS dispatch center to send, “5 engine companies as part of a total package of 30 engine companies”. Let the MABAS Division or non-MABAS department determine which specific departments or equipment to send from their own resources, task force, or interdivisional card.
- d) Once the individual MABAS Divisions or non-MABAS dispatch centers have determined and confirmed individual department responses, have their dispatch center call you back and confirm response and what agencies. Keep IEMA/SEOC and IOHNO advised with flowplan progress reports. Forward this information to the reception site officer via cellular telephone and provide them the security validation access code.
- e) If you are able to identify a caravan meeting point for units from a dispatch center, do so and instruct or suggest the initiating dispatch center have all responding units from that area meet at a single convoy point and caravan to the scene's staging site. Using the SEOC's directed routing to the reception site. Inform the responding leader or units of the required security validation access code via phone.
- f) From time to time, contact the IEMA/SEOC and IOHNO and update them on confirmed responses and from where.
- g) It is not your (RED Center) responsibility to provide change of quarters or local area coverage other than your home division's needs (RED Center and/or Orland Central) division involvement, however, you can recommend relocation of assets to IEMA if you know an area has been significantly drained of resource.
- h) Freelancing or self-dispatching is not allowed - use the security validation code system. Do not state the code over the radio nets, if compromised change code and notify reception officer and enroute units via telephone/cellular phones.

Security Validation Codes

- a) A security validation code system will be used to control access to only those authorized by RED Center dispatch to respond.
- b) A security validation code cannot be stated over a radio frequency. Communicating a security validation code to a unit/team directed for response must only be transmitted on telephones/cell phones/fax machines/face-to-face or other NOU radio frequency transmission records. Security validation codes are confidential in nature and all preventive actions should be taken to avoid compromise.
- c) RED Center operators determine the security validation code by selecting an arbitrary number, color and object (7 yellow balloons, or 15 pink corvettes - or - 3 green paramedics, etc.). Upon dispatch notification RED Center provides the code to the receiving communications center as part of the routing and reception area information which will be given to responding units. RED Center must advise the receiving dispatch center of the confidentiality of the routing, reception site location and security validation code. Explain for them to maintain the confidentiality and share it with responding units via phone and not via radio frequencies. Responding units will need the confidential information at the reception site (different then staging area).
- d) Responding units will be asked the validation code upon arrival at the designated reception site. Those who respond correctly ("3 yellow corvettes") will be allowed a safe route to staging area for incident commander use. Those who don't have the proper security validation code will not be allowed in staging, but rather put in a law enforcement holding area.
- e) RED Center operators will need to contact the SEOC and request they:
 - 1) Identify reception area near routing, but away from incident staging.
 - 2). Have the Incident Commander assign a reception officer at reception and have the SEOC get the reception officer a cell phone number so RED Center can call them and advise the security validation code and other pertinent information (specific units/divisions).
- f) Compromise of security validation code will require RED Center to create a new (number, color, object) code for use with responding units and advise the reception site officer and enroute units of the change in code and with what divisions/units.
- g) Should the code be compromised a MABAS/NIFERN radio call should not be made as an attempt to correct or modify the code.
- h) RED Center operators should call back all divisions/non-MABAS dispatch centers and ask that they attempt to have their responding units telephone them and give them the newly created security validation code and disregard the previous.
- i) The security access validation code will be changed everyday on large-scale campaigns.

Hazardous Materials and Technical Rescue Team Requests

- a) Any state IEMA/SEOC HazMat/TRT Team request will automatically be no less that five (5) full teams from any combination of MABAS divisions or non-MABAS departments dispatch center (minimum staffing – 10 hazmat technicians per team). TRT Teams may also have 1 or 2 person advance person arriving at reception before the full team.
- b) Follow the flow plan for the region regarding Haz-Mat/TRT Team sequence of response.
- c) Once the first five teams are dispatched, prepare your second round of dispatch with another package of five additional teams. Put the next five teams on alert for response. It is highly likely the second package will be needed immediately but rather for relief – but only send if IEMA/SEOC requests/authorizes same.

Post Event

- a) Save all notes, logs, documents and tapes.
- b) Prepare a summary report.
- c) Coordinate with RED Center's Director and MABAS Executive Board. Notify MABAS Executive Board members when this plan is activated, when time permits.

* b) Region I (Map C-3) is divided into east and west sectors. Due to the amount of resource in Northeast Illinois and the large geographic area of Region I, closest available resources require the east/west separation. Dispatchers, in coordination with SEOC shall determine whether east or west is used based on incident location and closest resources.

STATE OF ILLINOIS DISASTER PLAN ENHANCEMENTS

Goal

To enhance the State of Illinois Emergency Operations Plan (IEOP) by establishing a standard, statewide mutual aid plan for fire, EMS, hazardous materials mitigation, technical rescue and the like through a recognized system which will effectively support existing plans.

Objectives

Design a system interface between the MABAS system and the State of Illinois Emergency Operations Plan to mobilize EMS resources statewide during a time of need through coordination with IDPH (EMS) through the IOHNO.

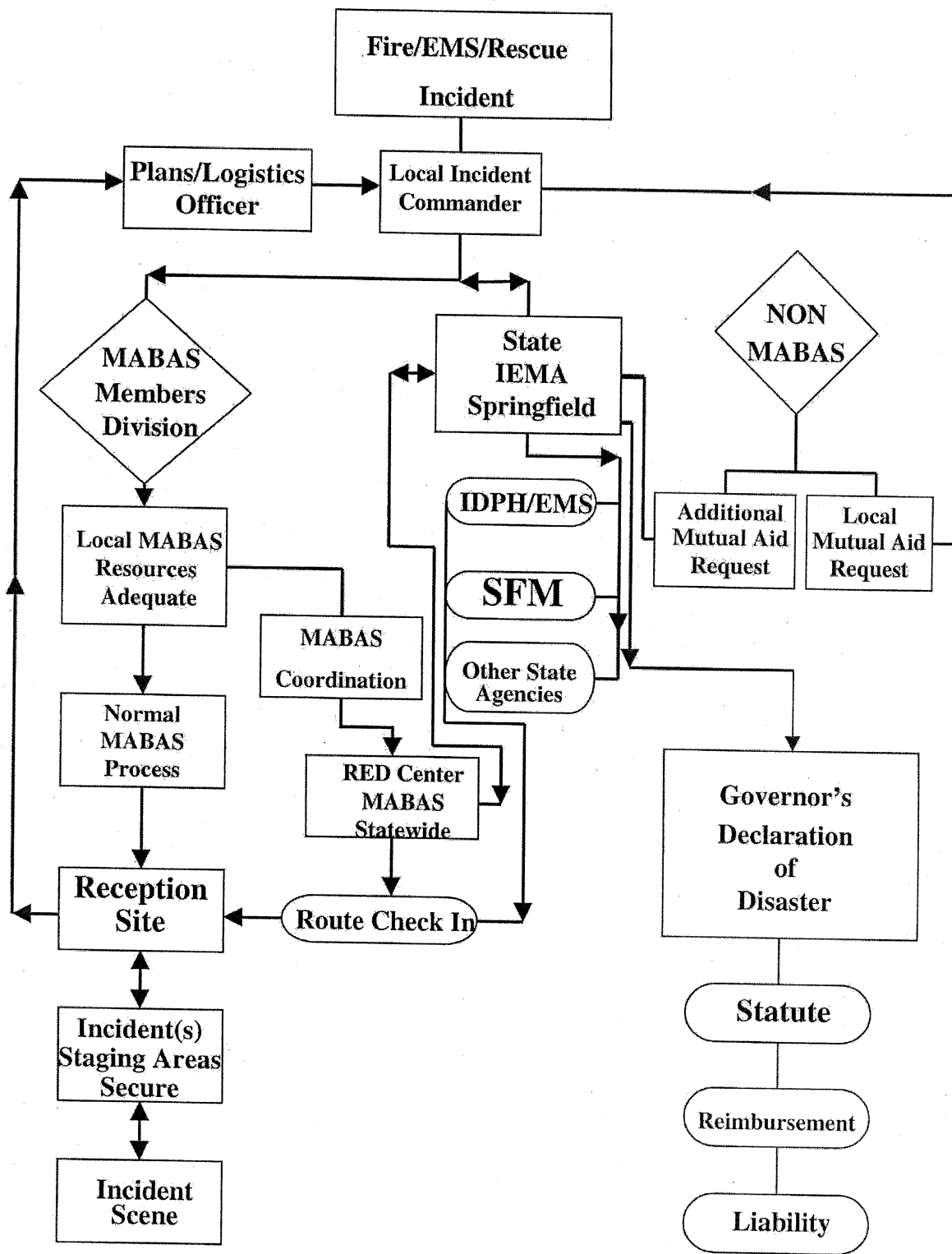
Design a system interface between the MABAS system and the state's disaster plan to mobilize fire/rescue and specialized capability resources statewide during a time of need through coordination with IEMA and OSFM office.

Integrate, modify or create statute to assure resource reimbursement, insurance and liability and tort immunity coverage for mobilized resources when requested by a stricken community's incident commander and affirmed by IEMA through the governor's office.

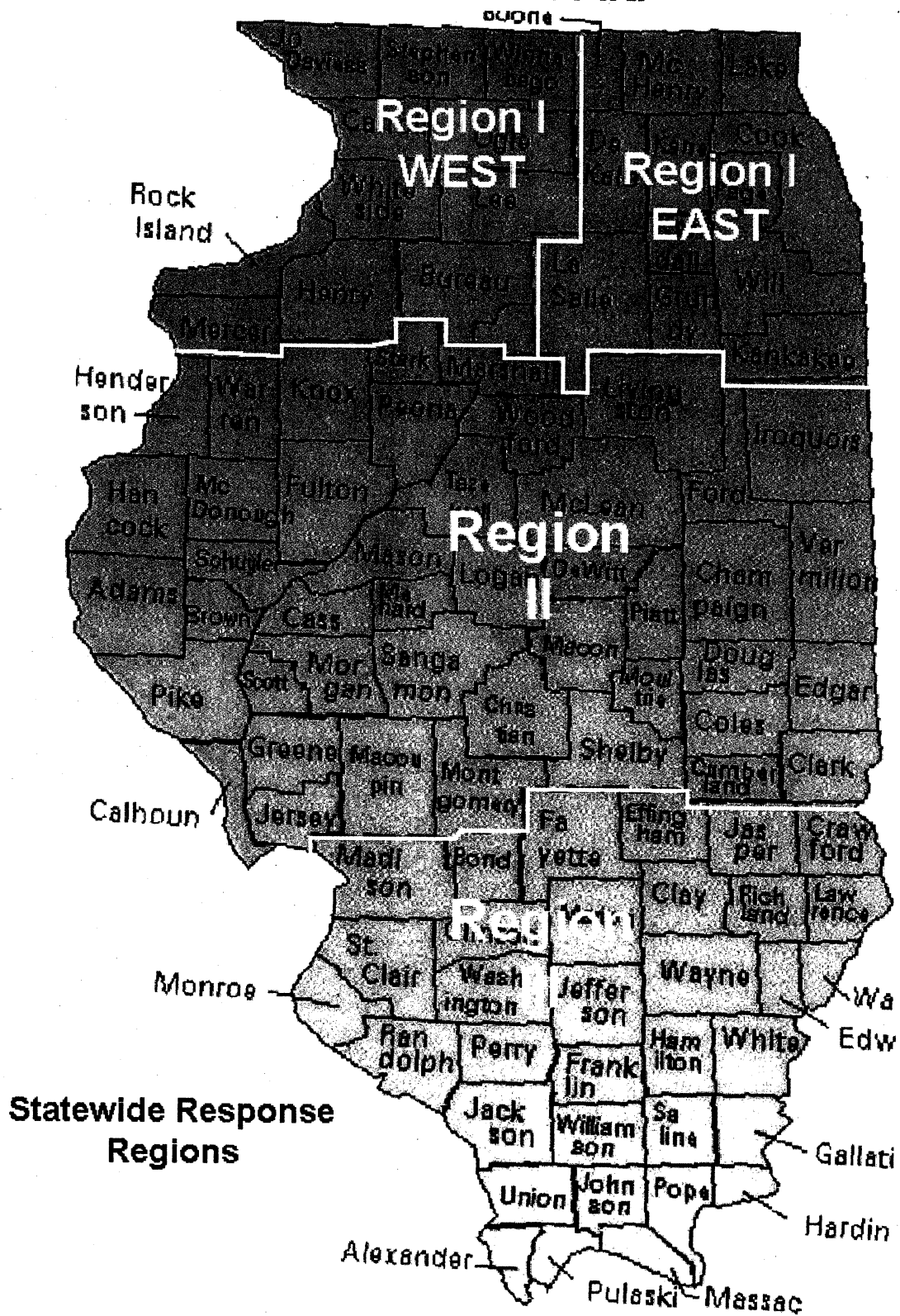
Construct Memorandum of Understanding and mobile support teams to facilitate a statewide mutual aid system, utilizing the MABAS system, their corporate documents and operational procedures as the standard for fire, EMS and specialized resources in a permissive manner for local units of government to access the system and its statutory covenants.

Fulfill a statewide disaster plan as not to diminish local command, control and the swift facilitation of MABAS resources during a time of need but rather as a mechanism to mobilize mass resources in a swift and coordinated manner with various state agencies.

Provide retroactive application of resources for rights, privileges, and reimbursement which according to a prescribed dispatch plan, become committed to the incident/event, prior to the confirmed actual Declaration of Disaster.

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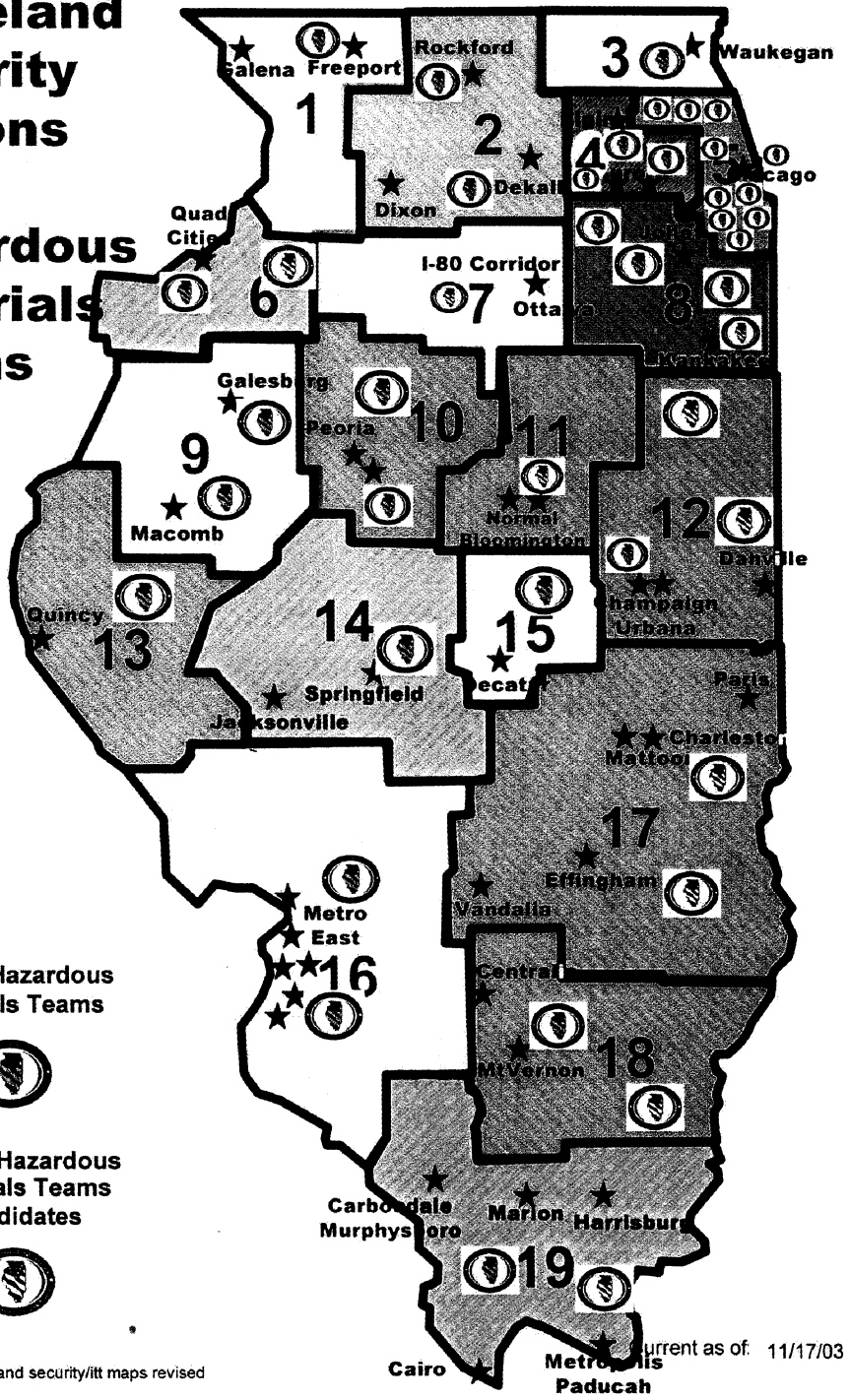

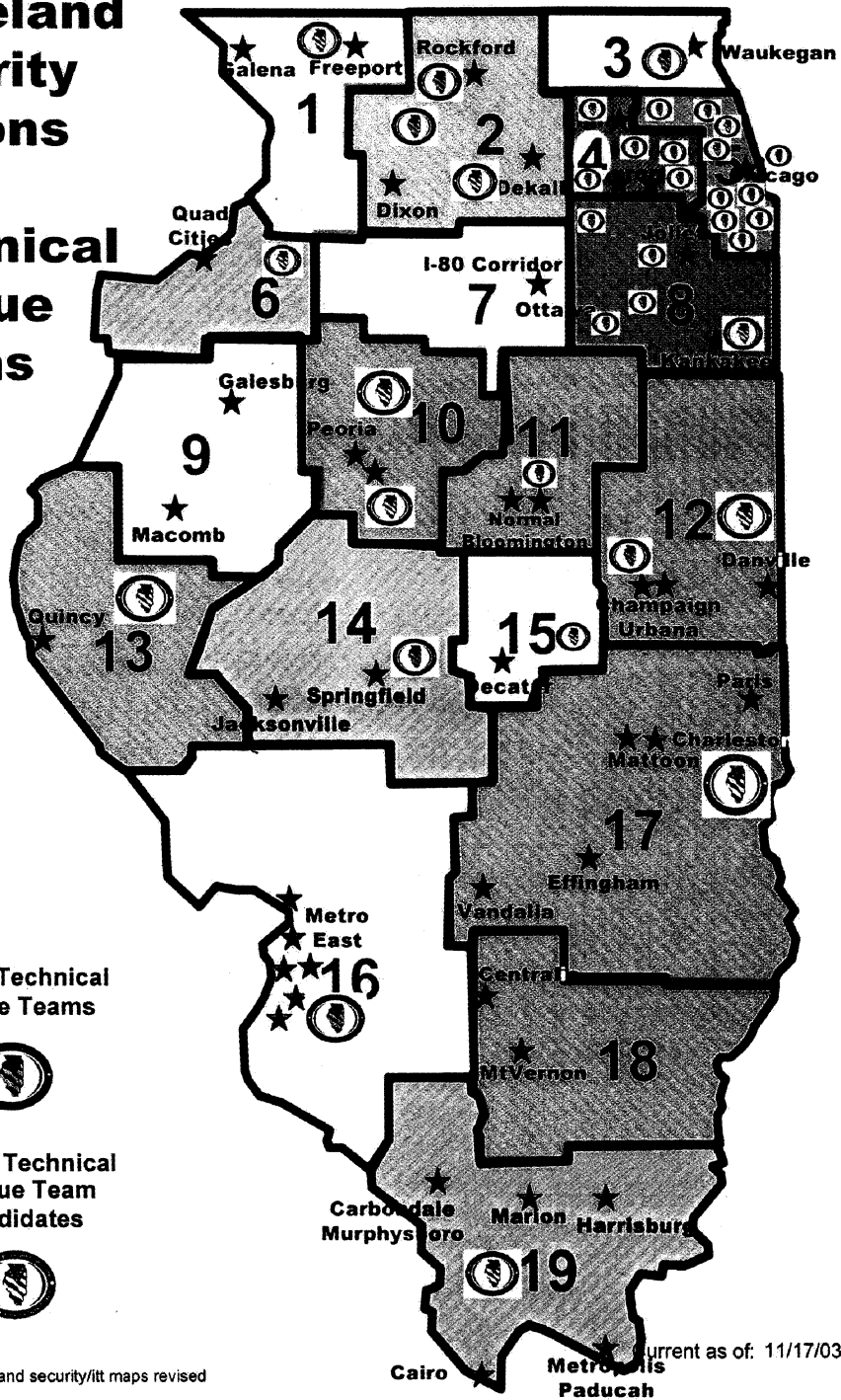

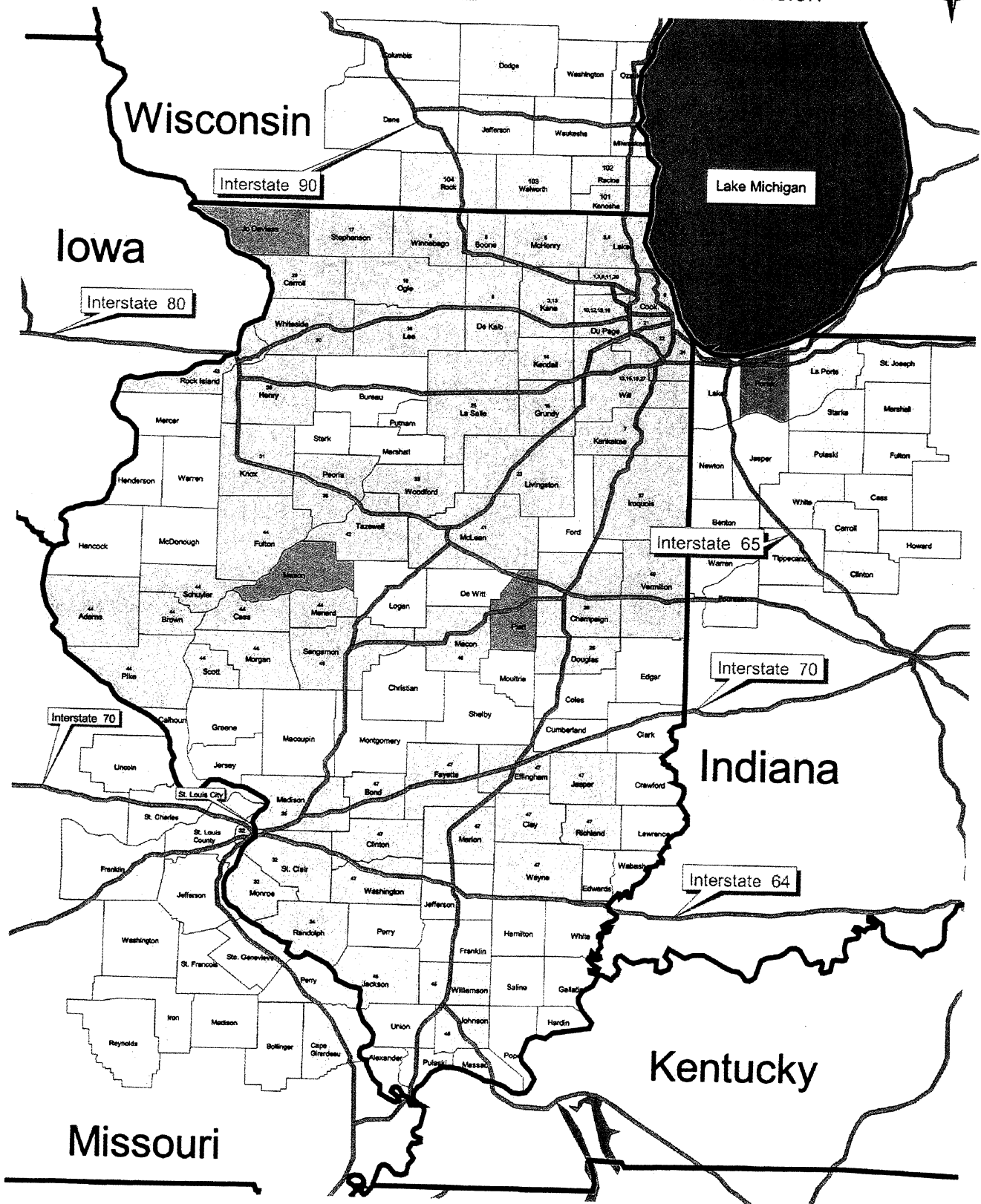

Accept our collective appreciation from MABAS member agencies for your commitment to coordinate and integrate local fire departments as part of the statewide domestic preparedness terrorism response plan. I shared our conversation and a copy of your April 11, 2000 memo with representatives from MABAS divisions at our April 27, 2000 Executive Board Meeting. All in attendance voiced a spirit of commitment to cooperate with agencies through your office.

Specifically, MABAS has agreed, in cooperation with the Illinois Fire Chiefs Association, to support a single fire service voice in a non-discriminatory manner. We will coordinate and facilitate contacts with Fire Chiefs in non-MABAS population centers throughout the state to develop a single set of standards, response protocols, and resources the Office of the State Fire Marshal can coordinate through IEMA. Response packages will provide a sustained and redundant capability to WMD terrorist attack involving biological or chemical agents. Of course, the fire system's development requires effort, time and key implementation steps. Your support and patience will tremendously assist as we move from planning through implementation.

A brief summary of the steps we will be pursuing and their sequence include:

- ◆ Formalization by questionnaire and sign off by MABAS HazMat Level A teams supporting a shared, cooperative concept.
- ◆ Conceptual agreement with Fire Chiefs from non-MABAS population centers, and their Level A HazMat teams, to the cooperative shared standardized approach. (Population centers include cities with state educational campuses, etc.).
- ◆ Development of a regional response network which combines jurisdictional HazMat team resources and is patterned to provide statewide sustained operations.
- ◆ Defining a local WMD detection and awareness training program and equipment package deployment plan (basic detection equipment plan).
- ◆ Holding a HazMat team "show and tell" whereas representatives (and possibly their equipment) are brought to one location. Conceptually all teams (MABAS or non-MABAS) can meet, share ideas, see equipment and begin the equipment and procedures standardization process. The action includes discussions and plans to address:
 - ◆ Regional package response plan.
 - ◆ Standardized WMD protective outerwear, including filtration masks.
 - ◆ Standardized expedient decontamination line capabilities for scene victims and first responders (time critical).
 - ◆ Equipment decontamination (protective gear, SCBA masks, ambulances, etc.).

- ◆ Finally, expansion of the statewide response concept to include special rescue teams, underwater rescue and recovery, building collapse teams, paramedic transport ambulances and various fire truck packages. The ultimate statewide mutual aid team that we previously had discussed.

Two other areas of discussion occurred at our April 10 meeting. They have been discussed and we'd suggest:

- ◆ A single fire dispatch coordination point for the State Fire Marshal's initiation of response packages as directed by the IEMA EOC. Initially, we recommend RED Center (Regional Emergency Dispatch), currently located in Glenview, Illinois and serving nine different Chicago suburban communities. The Center's response protocol will result from the previous development actions as coordinated through your office. As the system becomes a reality, it might be prudent to expand the dispatch sites to three locations; northern, central and southern Illinois. The sites could be directly linked to the State EOC through several communication methods.
- ◆ The second area involves IEMA regional response teams and fire service representatives assigned accordingly. We'd suggest fire service chiefs from northern, central and southern areas with each geographic area being comprised of four individuals by name; again a primary and three deep back-up. This results in a total of 12 individuals available for call up with regional assignments.

Please accept this correspondence as our commitment. I look forward to your concurrence and partnership in building a timeline. Your patience and assistance will truly develop a strong and lasting partnership between Illinois fire service and IEMA.

We look forward to a promising future with you and your agency.

Thank you for your recent letter regarding a working agreement between the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency. I appreciate the time and effort that you and the MABAS board have given to the issues of domestic terrorism, natural disasters and a statewide mutual aid system. I think the partnership we are building is important to the citizens of Illinois and we are committed to its success.

IEMA stands ready to provide any assistance it can as you expand the mutual aid system statewide. I would be glad to provide staff to attend meetings, conduct briefings or provide training regarding the state's concept of operations. Our ultimate goal is to provide the best, most efficient response to a catastrophic event, and working with groups like MABAS, CART and the Illinois Fire Chiefs Association is a priority.

I am in agreement that we need to formally identify primary points of contact to request assistance from the fire service. The RED center you have identified is fine with us. We still need to have a point of contact to work with in order for us to develop protocols, identify communications links, etc. If you would provide us with the name and phone number of a contact, we will work with that person to establish the necessary links.

I would like to see us eventually have a Memorandum Of Understanding signed between MABAS and IEMA formalizing our agreement with regard to things such as state activation and reimbursement. We have not really discussed reimbursement, but that would hinge on whether there is a governor's disaster declaration and how a MABAS team is activated (to be a state asset, it must be activated through the State Fire Marshal's Office in the State Emergency Operations Center as opposed to a direct box alarm response). We will discuss this issue more fully before an MOU is prepared.

Because the state has decided to develop three regional response teams based on the location of the State Police regions (we are counting Regions I and II as one for response capabilities), I would like to suggest that you identify fire service chiefs to serve as liaisons to those teams along the same geographic lines. A copy of the Illinois State Police regional boundaries is attached.

IEMA will be coordinating closely with the Office of the State Fire Marshal during this process. We also will have our chief legal counsel review existing laws to determine if they are adequate.

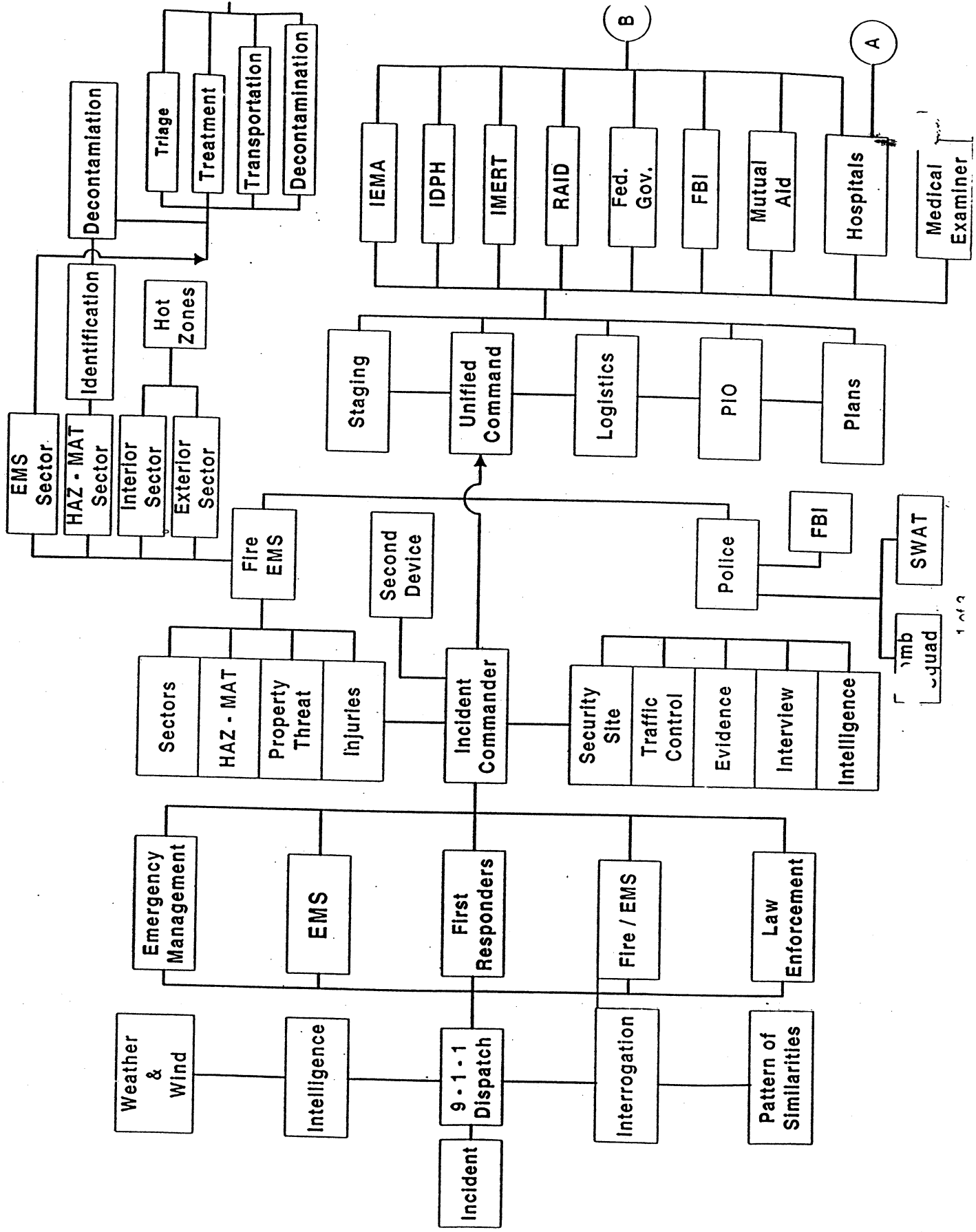

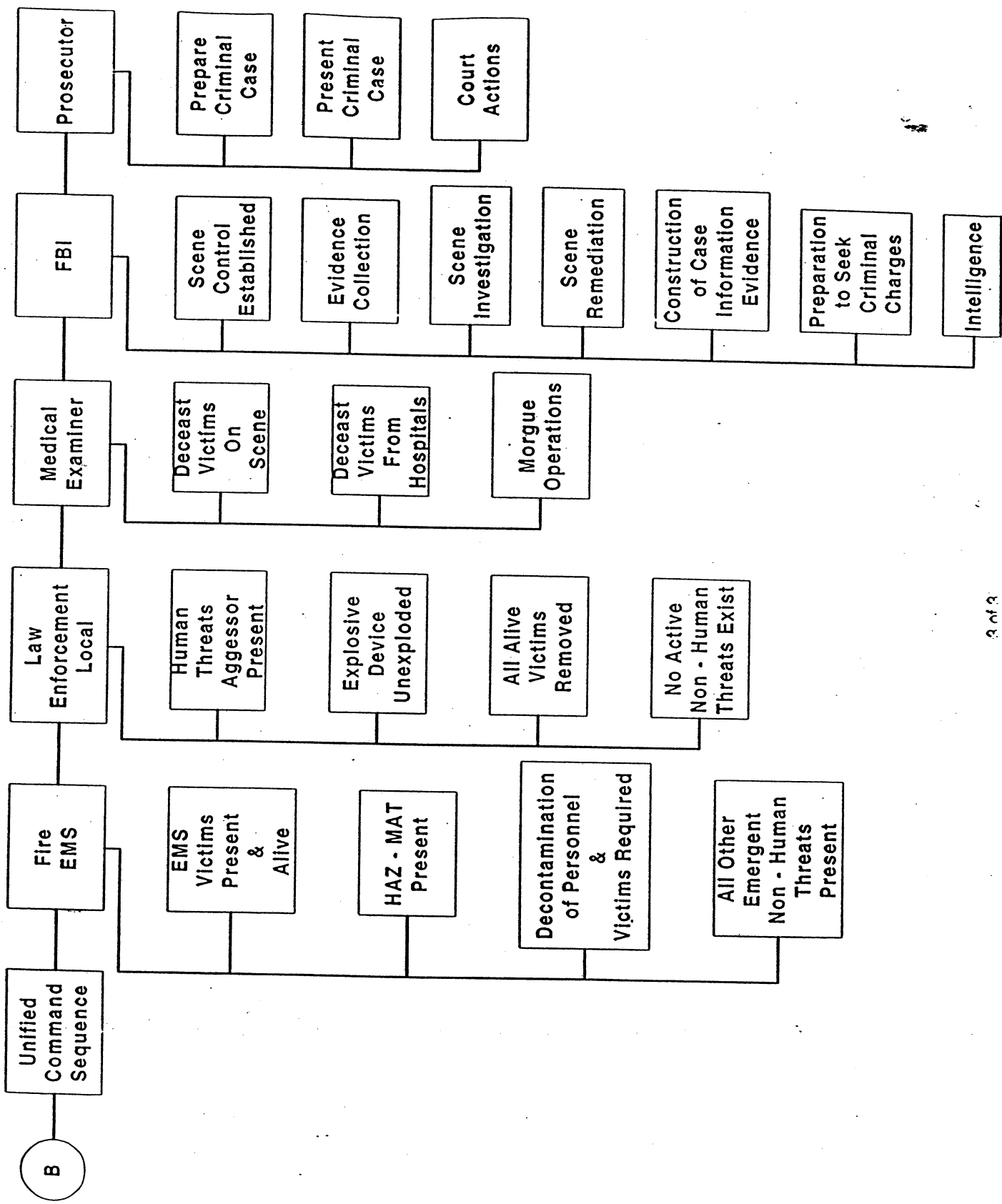

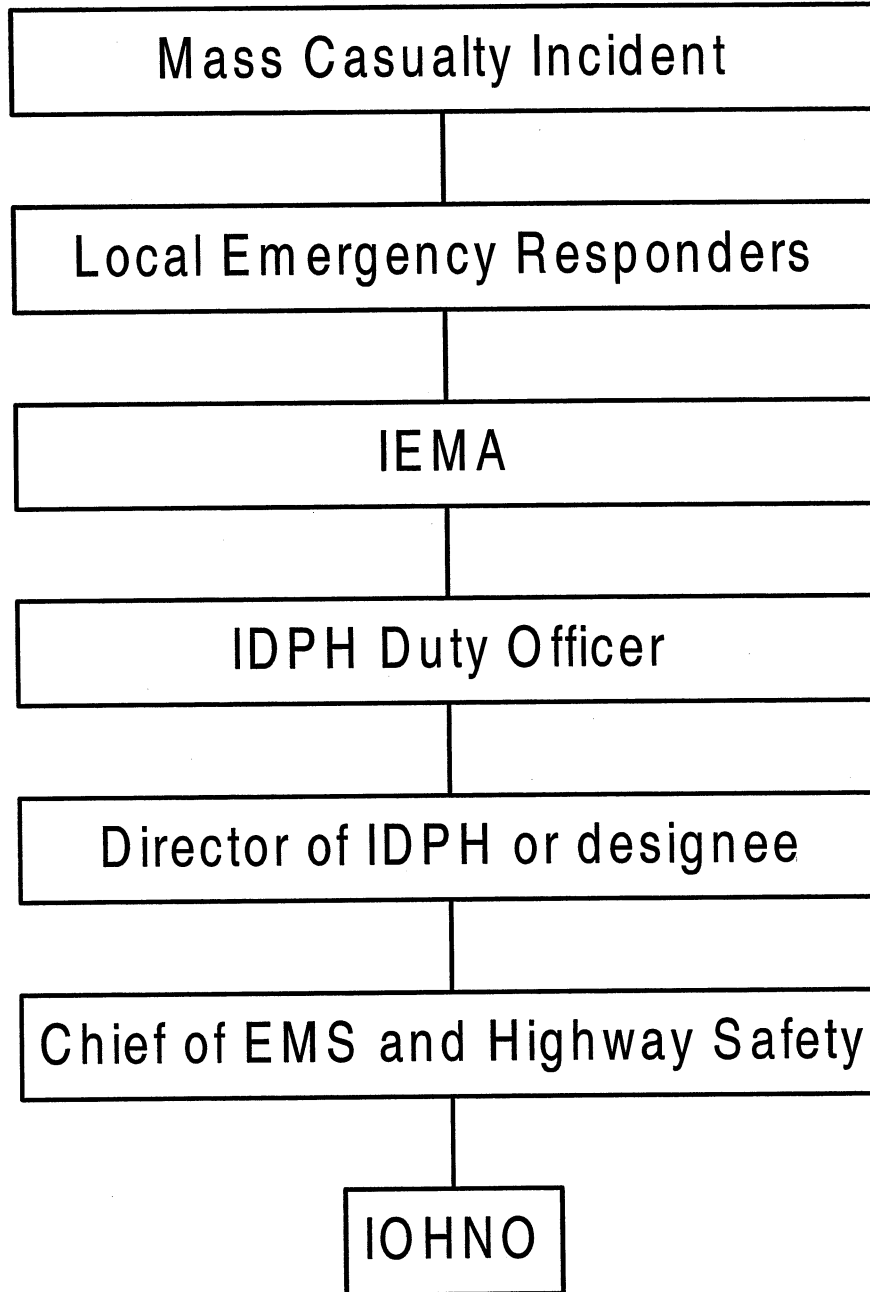

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT
STATE OF ILLINOIS
ILLINOIS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY

The Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) enter into and execute this Intergovernmental Agreement and hereby agree as follows:

A. AUTHORITY

This Agreement is entered into pursuant to the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act", 5 ILCS 220/1, et seq., and the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act", 20 ILCS.3305/1, et seq., and is subject to all applicable Illinois and Federal statutes, and related regulatory requirements. This agreement is applicable only to MABAS assets from local jurisdictions within the boundaries of the State of Illinois. All terminology in this Agreement shall be interpreted consistently with the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, and rules promulgated pursuant thereto.

B. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide disaster response assistance to units of local government during declared disasters when local and regional resources are insufficient to meet the disaster response needs of the requesting unit of local government, and to provide for disaster training exercises to maximize the effectiveness of responses to disaster related requests for assistance.

C. PERFORMANCE PERIOD

This Agreement shall remain in effect from January 16, 2001, until January 1, 2006, unless renewed or terminated earlier pursuant to Section I of this Agreement.

D. PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING OR PROVIDING ASSISTANCE DURING A DECLARED DISASTER

When a disaster is declared to have occurred within the jurisdiction of a local governmental unit by the Governor of the State of Illinois, and the resources available through local or regional units are insufficient to adequately respond to the disaster such that the local resources are being utilized to the fullest possible extent, the affected local governmental unit may request assistance from IEMA by contacting the State

Emergency Operations Center (SEOC). All IEMA approved requests for assistance to or from the fire service shall be coordinated within the SEOC through the Office of State Fire Marshall (OSFM) liaison, with the exception of licensed emergency medical transport units under the jurisdiction of the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH). The SEOC may request assistance from MABAS. Upon receipt of a request for assistance from the SEOC, MABAS shall dispatch to the affected area any and all personnel and equipment which are available from the MABAS membership. Personnel and equipment so dispatched shall report to the State Incident Commander at the State Forward Command Post (SFCP), who shall then assign the personnel and equipment to the Local Incident Commander in support of local operations. Upon completion of the disaster response operation, the dispatched personnel and equipment shall be subject to further re-assignment in support of the operation at the discretion of the State Incident Commander. The State Incident Commander may either re-assign the personnel and equipment for additional missions, or provide for the timely release of the personnel and equipment to the sending local governmental units.

E. PROCEDURE FOR DISASTER TRAINING EXERCISES

During any training exercises, the procedure set forth in paragraph D, above, shall be followed by the training participants, as required to achieve the objectives of the training exercise. All training exercises will be subject to the mutual agreement and availability of units to participate.

F. LIABILITY AND RISK OF LOSS FOR DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT AND INJURIES TO PERSONNEL

Equipment dispatched pursuant to this Agreement shall become property of the State of Illinois while it is being used pursuant to this Agreement. Personnel dispatched pursuant to this agreement shall be members of Mobile Support Teams, as provided in Section 8 of the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/8) during their service pursuant to this Agreement. Liability for damages to equipment and/or injuries to personnel shall be determined pursuant to relevant provisions of the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/1, et seq.) and all other applicable statutes.

G. REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE COST OF RESPONSE

Responding agencies acting pursuant to this Agreement shall be reimbursed for all eligible costs incurred for responses approved by IEMA pursuant to this Agreement and in accordance with the "Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act" (20 ILCS 3305/1, et seq.) and other applicable statutes. Eligible costs are those incurred on or

after the date of a disaster event that is the subject of a State disaster declaration. Except for costs covered under Section F of this Agreement, responding agencies may be reimbursed, in whole or in part, for those costs incurred prior to receiving IEMA's approval. Such determination shall be at the sole discretion of IEMA in accordance with statutory authority.

H. ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Director of IEMA may, at his or her discretion, appoint an Advisory Committee to assist in the implementation and refinement of this Agreement. The membership of such committee shall include a minimum of one (1) MABAS representative.

I. AMENDMENTS, RENEWAL, AND TERMINATION

This Agreement may only be amended upon the written agreement of the parties hereto. This Agreement may be renewed for an additional specific term upon the written agreement of the parties hereto. This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon 90 days written notice, as provided in Section J, following.





RE: MABAS Oversight Command Team

Purpose: The purpose of the MABAS Command Oversight Team and this procedural memo is to provide a succession of MABAS leadership, deployed assignment procedures, and functional taskings in the event Chicago Fire Department MABAS Division 9 activates its response box alarm cards, and/or in the event the statewide mutual aid plan for fire/EMS or special operations teams is activated.

Part I - Division 9 MABAS Activation

Procedure: In the event Chicago Fire Department (MABAS Division 9) activates MABAS box alarm response cards and/or the statewide fire/EMS/special operations teams plan, the following assignments shall occur.

- A. RED Center Dispatch shall activate notification via pagers of the MABAS Command Oversight Team member's listed on Attachment A using the following message: "MABAS Oversight Command Officers report to your assigned deployed locations- Division 9 activation". (Refer to Attachment A and see Attachment C for team pager numbers.)
- B. RED Center shall coordinate with the CFD main fire alarm office with their pre-assigned MABAS divisions the dispatch and response of resources requested by CFD MABAS Division 9 as listed on their MABAS Box Alarm cards.
- C. Orland Central shall coordinate with the Englewood fire alarm office and their pre-assigned MABAS divisions, the dispatch and response of resources requested by CFD MABAS Division 9 as listed on their MABAS box alarm cards.
- D. RED Center and Orland Central dispatch centers have the authority to modify the assigned responses as required to assure quantities of resources requested by Division 9 or their box alarm cards are fully met.

- E. RED Center and Orland Central shall obtain staging locations of equipment as directed by CFD. Currently, the CFD Fire Academy and Comiskey Park are pre-defined staging sites, however, CFD may modify staging locations as they see fit. Responding MABAS Oversight Command members shall be notified of the CFD selected staging sites by RED Center.
- F. Following pager notification of MABAS Command Oversight Team members, each responding Oversight Team member shall confirm their response to RED Center via telephone (847-724-5700) or via radio on NIFERN frequency. Team members shall automatically report to their predetermined assigned deployment location (see Attachment A) unless otherwise directed by a command and control MABAS Oversight Team member.
- G. In the event a MABAS Oversight Team member is unable to respond, the primary, alternate, tertiary system will prevail. The goal is to assure primary assignments at identified deployed locations is always filled. Team members will fill the position of "primary" by moving up on the assignment list if known vacancies exist. Oversight Command and control team members may provide redirection as circumstances mandate.
- H. All MABAS Oversight Team members shall communicate primarily on the NIFERN frequency, secondarily on cell phones, or as may be directed based on circumstances.
- I. CFD MABAS Division 9 requests for special rescue teams shall be filled by using the flow sequence for special rescue teams listed in the statewide plan for Region I – East (page J-46). This procedure shall be used until CFD Division 9 develops a SRT box alarm card. RED Center shall be solely responsible for notification and mobilization of assigned SRT teams listed on the statewide plan. In the event SRT teams are requested, send five (5) SRT teams per request or per extra alarm level requested by CFD MABAS Division 9. RED Center need not state the color CART team dispatched from the statewide plan, simply the MABAS Division number and "CART" response.

Part II – Statewide Mutual Aid Activation

Procedure: Upon transition to or activation of the statewide mutual aid plan for the City of Chicago (Division 9) or at any other location in the state of Illinois, the following procedures and actions shall occur.

- A. RED Center shall assume sole responsibility for dispatch notification, routing and coordination of resources as directed by the State EOC (EOC manager, OSFM, or IDPH direction). Orland Central shall provide backup to RED Center in the event RED Center is unable to fulfill the mission or as may be requested by RED to provide assistance during the event.
- B. RED Center shall be the single point of contact direct with the State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) by telephone. The SEOC shall provide RED Center all pertinent information as required by the state mutual aid plan's checklists. RED shall relay the information on to tasked dispatch centers and responding resources.
- C. RED Center shall notify via pager the MABAS Oversight Team members listed on Attachment B by pager. The paged message should read "MABAS Oversight Team members – Statewide mutual aid plan activation – respond to your assignments on Attachment B."
- D. MABAS Oversight Team members able to respond will notify RED Center (847-724-5700) by phone or radio (NIFERN) of their response and enroute location per Attachment B.
- E. Vacancies of oversight team members will be filled upward in the same manner as described within Part I (G) of this memorandum's procedure.

Threat Conditions characterize the risk of terrorist attack. Protective Measures are the steps that will be taken by government and the private sector to reduce vulnerabilities. The HSAS establishes five Threat Conditions with associated suggested Protective Measures:

Low Condition Green

Low risk of terrorist attacks. The following Protective Measures may be applied:

- Refining and exercising preplanned Protective Measures;
- Ensuring personnel receive training on HSAS, departmental, or agency-specific Protective Measures; and
- Regularly assessing facilities for vulnerabilities and taking measures to reduce them.

Guarded Condition Blue

General risk of terrorist attack. In addition to the previously outlined Protective Measures, the following may be applied:

- Checking communications with designated emergency response or command locations;
- Reviewing and updating emergency response procedures; and
- Providing the public with necessary information.

Elevated Condition Yellow

Significant risk of terrorist attacks. In addition to the previously outlined Protective Measures, the following may be applied:

- Increasing surveillance of critical locations;
- Coordinating emergency plans with nearby jurisdictions;
- Assessing further refinement of Protective Measures within the context of the current threat information; and
- Implementing, as appropriate, contingency and emergency response plans.

High Condition Orange

High risk of terrorist attacks. In addition to the previously outlined Protective Measures, the following may be applied:

- Coordinating necessary security efforts with armed forces or law enforcement agencies;
- Taking additional precaution at public events;
- Preparing to work at an alternate site or with a dispersed workforce; and
- Restricting access to essential personnel only.

Severe Condition Red

Severe risk of terrorist attacks. In addition to the previously outlined Protective Measures, the following may be applied:

- Assigning emergency response personnel and pre-positioning specially trained teams;
- Monitoring, redirecting or constraining transportation systems;
- Closing public and government facilities; and
- Increasing or redirecting personnel to address critical emergency needs.

HazMat Teams**

Subject: Hazardous Materials Team Mutual Aid Requests in the Absence of a Declared Disaster.

Purpose: To provide guidance clarifying statewide mutual aid assistance requests for hazardous materials teams specifically involving suspected terrorist acts through IEMA SEOC.

Coordinating Agencies: MABAS, IEMA, FBI, OSFM, other statewide fire & hazmat teams and agencies.

Special Request Protocol Guidelines

- ◆ The following protocol guideline does not apply to incident scenes where any form of a bona fide crisis event has occurred. Incident scenes where a terrorist act has occurred profoundly demonstrating damage, injuries and/or fatalities the characteristics of a bona fide crisis event should be handled by the incident commander as they see fit, excluding the guidelines within this document. Emergency assistance should be summoned without delay through mutual aid agreements and/or the fire/EMS/special teams statewide plan (via IEMA SEOC) without hesitation.
- ◆ Incidents where fire authorities are summoned to assist and are investigative in nature and where an imminent threat to life and property does not exist, should apply the following guidelines when requesting outside assistance of an agency, mutual aid, hazardous materials team through IEMA.
 - ◆ When an unknown substance exists, suspected to be a chemical or biological, an initial screening by the on-scene incident commander should be made before a hazardous materials team, mutual aid request (MABAS based or non-MABAS statewide plan based through IEMA) is made, including:
 - ◆ Has any form of an articulated threat been made against the company, person(s), or surroundings by a known or unknown source stating a potential hostile capability?
 - ◆ Is the individual or property high profile such as government, post office, elected official, celebrity or well-known individual?
 - ◆ Is/are the individual, office, structure or business a recognized media outlet (newspaper, radio, television station, etc.)?
 - ◆ Does a bona fide need exist in the interest of the public, to rapidly determine whether the suspected product possesses or presents a threat to life and/or property in a public sense (library, school, government building, hospital, etc.)?
 - ◆ Has the incident scene and suspect product thoroughly been investigated to rule out other natural, non-hostile threats which may indicate the unknown substance is the result of an accident and not an intentional hostile action?
- ◆ If the situation or incident scene meets or exceeds any of the previously identified criteria, the incident commander should consult with IEMA SEOC and see if concurrence exists to dispatch a hazmat team to the incident scene for assistive product analysis, mitigation and/or possibly evidence collection. When a hazmat team is dispatched to the scene following consultation with IEMA (who will consult with an FBI field office prior to authorization and dispatch of a mutual aid hazmat team). An FBI field agent shall also respond to the incident scene whenever a hazmat mutual aid team is sent by the direction of IEMA or if any of the screening criteria listed is met.
- ◆ IEMA will not provide reimbursement for non-declared responses. If the IEMA SEOC coordinates the request for a hazmat team to be dispatched to the scene, IEMA will not provide any form of reimbursement to any participating party. All associated costs and liabilities will be borne by the requesting organizations, unless a declaration of disaster has been declared.

Mutual Aid Protocol – HazMat Teams

- ◆ When an incident or incident scene does not meet the test of any of the previously stated screening questions, requesting a mutual aid hazmat team is not warranted. Requests through IEMA's SEOC for hazmat team assistance should not be made.
- ◆ Situations and incident scenes where the mutual aid hazmat team request is not warranted, yet the owner or property occupant still requests produce analysis and determination, referrals to private contracting agencies should be suggested by the incident commander.
- ◆ These guidelines and protocols do not apply, nor supercede, any local automatic or mutual aid agreements between municipalities and districts regarding hazmat team response. Such agreements shall prevail and are locally managed, excluding IEMA unless a declaration of disaster may be warranted.
- ◆ Local and statutory spiller-pays laws are not pre-empted by this protocol and are determined applicable by the authority having jurisdiction where the incident occurs.
